Biblical Psalms:

Psalm 6

- 1 O Lord, rebuke me not in thine indignation * neither chasten me in thy displeasure.
- 2 Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am weak * O Lord, heal me, for my bones are vexed.
- 3 My soul also is sore troubled * but, Lord, how long wilt thou punish me?
- 4 Turn thee, O Lord, and deliver my soul * O save me for thy mercy's sake.
- 5 For in death no man remembereth thee * and who will give thee thanks in the pit?
- 6 I am weary of my groaning; every night wash I my bed * and water my couch with my tears.
- 7 My beauty is gone for very trouble * and worn away because of all mine enemies.
- 8 Away from me, all ye that work vanity * for the Lord hath heard the voice of my weeping.
- 9 The Lord hath heard my petition * the Lord will receive my prayer.
- 10 All mine enemies shall be confounded, and sore vexed * they shall be turned back, and put to shame suddenly.
